The coming of age of the Flyball Nats!

Awesome Pawsome members are thrilled to host this year's event and we are pleased to have the opportunity to show off this great venue we have the privilege to use.

The Undercover Arena at the RSPCA Complex at Wacol has eventuated due to a very generous donation from Anne and Paul Newman. We would like to take this opportunity to thank Anne and Paul once again for their support of Flyball.

Cancelling race meets due to rain is no longer necessary, thanks to Anne and Paul.

A roof over our heads is just one of the features at this venue. The sound proofing on the walls and open ceiling ensure the ears are not suffering. We can stand at the fence line and have a conversation while the racing is on, no earplugs needed at Wacol!

The kitchen, amenities, lighting, the blinds, and fans. Wi-Fi, electrical wiring in the ceiling and the placement of storage rooms for ease of rolling out the matting etc. The fencing around the fields so the resident kangaroos are not a threat to the dogs!! The Black Cat Café and parking, all add to a pleasant experience when training and racing – thanks to the RSPCA and Anne and Paul.

The rings working independently of each other has been a huge challenge, with us having to think outside of the square. If we just did up two independent running orders it meant a large number of clashes as six clubs have teams in both rings.

It is also important to ensure the spectators have something happening in at least one ring at any one time. We have staggered the breaks. This will also ensure the lines at the Café are kept at a minimum.

It also helps with the clashes too; it won't eliminate them but helps.

Our National Stewards will take away the need for handlers to steward at all over the three days. These special people are from a combination of clubs who have come forward to help out. They are mainly new to Flyball and have both sat the steward's exam and also done a lot of practical work over the last few months to be prepared for the onslaught! David and Helen Strong are joining us from Tassie just to Steward. Thanks David and Helen. Everyone else is from Qld and has either told their clubs they aren't available to help or are working around doing both.

Thank you all 25 of you who will be both Marshals and Stewards for us – keep an eye out for them – they will be wearing hi-vis vests. Give them a high five when you see them – they deserve it.



Your welcome packs – here is some of the items you will find:

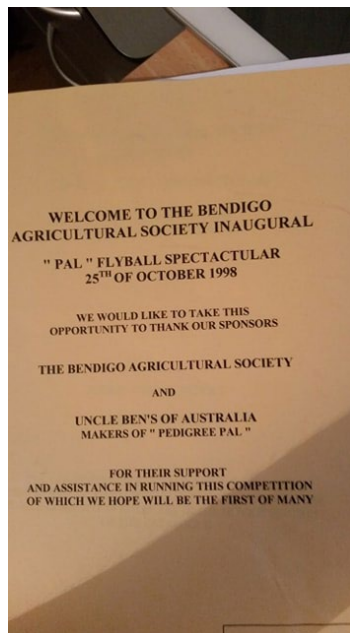

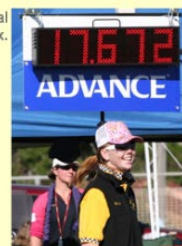


## Australia breaks the 18 second barrier....

The AFA Committee has confirmed that Norwest Thunderdogs 1 has set a new official Australian record 17.672 seconds at "Australian National Flyball Racing Championships held at Redcliffe Brisbane on Sunday 10th June 2007. The height was 11" & using a Tim Walker US Flyball box. The team ran on an outdoor grass surface in sunny Queensland conditions.

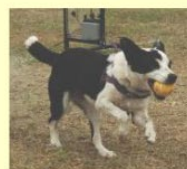

The Australian Flyball Association (AFA) and Flyball Racing has come a very long way since the 13<sup>th</sup> of October 1996 when, at the Queanbeyan Bowling Club on a sunny Sunday afternoon, a small group of people created the Australian Flyball Association.

Competitions (that's what they were called in the olden days) now called Race Meetings were very high on the agenda the first being held at EPIC (Exhibition Park in Canberra), I think in 1997.

Some would be mortified to know that in the beginning there were not enough trained dogs to compete off lead so wait for it we invented Novice Flyball where dogs and handlers would compete on lead, this initiative created enough interest in the sport to get it off the ground. Novice flyball was discontinued the following year after a handler got caught up in the start gates falling heavily on the base of the contraption built to house the infrared beams for the timing gear and was seriously injured.

The sport gradually spread into NSW and Victoria creating a dedicated group of travelers who would go interstate with equipment to help set up official AFA Race Meetings.

The first Timing system was built with plans for a timer to measure the speed of a bullet found in a gun magazine thankfully we could slow it down enough to measure the speed of a Flyball Team those days 32 seconds was the cutting edge of division 1.

The second generation of timing system in Australia was designed and built by avionics engineer David Blow and was called The Judge and detected false starts and bad passes, we had moved into the 21<sup>st</sup> century.

Some years later the AFA took delivery of its first FarmTec timing system and the excitement leading up to its first race meeting was palpable – It was wireless and had pretty much the same components as the last one delivered to Australia just a couple of years ago.

Now here we are at the 21<sup>st</sup> Australian Flyball Association National Championships being held in a purpose-built undercover arena made possible by the generosity of Anne Newman and the RSPCA, home ground to the Awesome Pawsome Flyball Club.

Flyball Racing is a galaxy away from where it all began and the future will present endless opportunities for the sport of Flyball Racing to grow, can't wait for the next chapter in the growth of this wonderful sport that will enhance the lives of many thousands of dogs and handlers into the future.

From my humble beginnings at the Croydon & District Obedience Dog Club in Vic in 1988 with one of my dogs Tyson and while there we found flyball. I was obedience & agility trialling at the time but that wavered quickly when flyball took over in 1992 when one of our Croydon members, Roger Cameron came back from USA with this new craze called flyball.

The first four years we were travelling around Victoria demonstrating the sport at agricultural shows, school fetes etc until some members from the Queanbeyen Flyball Club formed the Australian Flyball Association Inc. in 1996. I have seen numerous changes and trained seven flyball dogs including five to "Onyx", four to "Grand Champion" and one to the "Jeddah Award" in the best canine sport in this country in my 27 years as a flyball enthusiast.

In this time I've also been 10 years as a Victorian Representative travelling around Victoria doing mini seminars to teach clubs the fundamentals of the sport, been a Flyball Judge for 12 years judging the sport and trying to run three flyball dogs at the same time and also on the AFA committee for 8 years including two as the AFA president, now time for a rest and let some others take over.

Some of the changes I have seen are on the equipment, flyball box & jumps, ring size (30' x 90') this all has now grown enormously with the sport. Ring sizes which now are in excess of 45' x 150' as our training techniques and dogs speed has become faster and faster. When I first started and a lot of green dogs were competing in 1997 we didn't only have a flyball ring of dogs running lead free but we also had a novice ring where we were allowed to run dogs with a lead, you may laugh but that is how it was, now we look at this and think of how dangerous this technique was at the time.

The very early flyball box (see pic) was where there was an extended arm with a jam tin on the end where you put the ball in and the dog would hit the pedal and ball would fly in the air for the dog to catch, wow! How this has changed when speed became the ultimate game for our dogs.

From 1992-96 the only jumps we had were 16", no heights, this all changed when the AFA abided by the rules of the North American Flyball Association Inc. and included heights so all dogs could compete, even the littlies which were known as height dogs and our bigger dogs could then race over the same height, and became a lot faster.

Queanbeyen had the fastest team around (22-23 seconds) in Australia very early on until Croydon came up and beat them. We were all very excited when we broke 20 seconds for the very first time, now there are some teams that have times in the 16 second range, again wow!!!

The title point system for the dogs have changed as well, for a number of the AFA's early existence you would get 25 points for a clean heat under 24 seconds, 5 points in the range of 24-28 seconds, 1 point in the 28-32 second range and you got nothing for the dogs if your team raced over the 32 second mark, that's right nothing (poor dogs). The dogs in America still race under this points system today. This happened until the AFA president at the time, Steve Pitt decided that how you could teach the slower dog's flyball and not gain title points, this just didn't seem fair, and so the title point system of today was put to a vote at the AGM and passed unanimously.

I have travelled overseas to Belgium and ran a dog at the 2000 European Flyball championships with Steve Pitt and Cathy Trudinger (we ran a team and won our division) who used to run "Jeddah" whom the AFA's Jeddah Award (4000 points) has been named after, this competition up until this day is still the best flyball competition I've ever been to, and Steve can vouch for that. There were teams there from France, England, Switzerland, Italy, Holland etc.

They don't race for points in Europe, but boy do they know how to have fun, won't mention those "duuvels" hey Steve, can't believe that it's been 19 years already.



Also travelled to and seen competitions in Canada and the USA in 2005 and ran a dog for the Spring-loaded 2<sup>nd</sup> fastest team running in the 16 second range, stayed with friends from Canada, Ron and Geri English. Ron did a seminar in Australia after one of our Nationals competitions, can't remember the year. Also had an awesome time there. You can say that flyball has been a fair part of our lives and we certainly made lots of friends along the way. Thank you for being our friends!

At present I have two flyball dogs still running with "Cindy" who has just turned 10 years & "Scruffy" who is nearly 9 years, these will be my last as I am not young anymore and I can spend more quality time with the family. But the future of flyball I can say looks very healthy & bright.

Thank you to the people who make our sport what it is today – AFA committee, judges, timekeepers stewards and competitors.

22 years ago, I became addicted to a new dog sport called flyball. In those days flyball boxes only had one centre hole, dogs ran straight onto the box to grab the ball, turn and run back. They usually got another ball thrown at the back of the ring as a reward. A fast time for a 4-dog team was 23 seconds. Now we have teams doing just over 16 seconds.

There were a limited of competitions, but the numbers grew quickly. By 2002 we had competitions in NSW, Victoria and Queensland. We didn't care how fast our dogs were in the old days, we just cared that we had taught our dogs to do the run successfully.

My first racing dog was a Cavalier King Charles named Indiana. We saw some dogs training at CDC in Canberra and stopped to watch. One of the girls asked if we wanted to have a go. Indy retrieved balls so I gave him a go, running alongside the jumps with him, telling him to get the ball, and running back again. He successfully did the run, so the next time I just told him to get the ball and he went by himself. It was acceptable to run with them in competitions in the novice section. Two days later we competed in the first Australian competition in 1997. How things have changed!!

And not only with the dogs; handlers are much noisier these days - screeching with excitement to encourage their dog to run faster and wearing special shoes and bright coloured shirts. Nowadays the competitive handlers not only train their dogs to jump and do swimmers turn on the box, but they treat their dogs like Olympic athletes. Dogs have regular trips to be massaged, checked out physically and have special fitness programmes.

Dog breeding programmes are in place to increase the probability of speedier dogs mixing some breeds for drive, speed and size.

Our sport is encouraging junior handlers to race dogs as well.

All my dogs since Indiana have competed in flyball competitions - 2 Cavaliers, 4 Border Collies and 2 Papillons – and they have all loved the game.

For me Flyball started back in 1995, when it was all new and Steve Pitt came to the Queanbeyan dog club, was the first time we saw it. So, after my dog Cujo, who couldn't do obedience for quids, Steve asked a group of us to come down to Ray Morton Park in Queanbeyan and try Flyball.

Well back then Queanbeyan Bushrangers was the club to go to, as they looked like the whole thing was fun. Over the years I have seen many changes:

- when I first started main dogs were Border collies; my Cujo and Turbo were pretty much the 1st mixed breeds to compete...how far we've come.
- in 1996 the curve box came out and that was wow, and it had a rubber front. Now they have lines on the bottom, straight, aluminium, metal and we have touch boards when previously just sending the dog straight was ok until "the curve" made speed and dogs physic better.
- styles of releasing our dogs was interest - the kneeling on the ground with your dog's butt in your face and the dog using you as a launch pad, boy I don't miss those days, from scratched up legs, and if the dog was excited, well let's say have that butt in your face was not good thing!
- more clubs started to involve - Croydon Rockets were a large Victorian club, there was many travels for competitions and crashing at Eric and Isobel's place. Then there was Tequilla - we met Gouchiee, Sydney was also forming, Parramatta, Canberra had the mighty CDC, and it was growing. From there Teams like the Hoonsquad, Croydon Rockets, were racing times of 25 seconds at Indoor Arenas at Melbourne Royal and the Cow Pavilion at Easter Royal.

In 1998 I got my second dog Turbo; we broke away from Bushrangers and formed K9 Krusaders.

We were asked to come to Sydney to be filmed with Harry's Practice. Here I met Leonie Prichard with Buddy, an up and coming competitor against Turbo, from a club called Norwest. Looking back now the whole filming was hilarious, the dogs moved to quickly for the cameras, so they had a helicopter to get sports cameras.

The old lights, which were designed for the crowd to see and these huge clunky passing line boxes. The lights have evolved over the years from the old clunky boxes that needed to be run by a car battery, to flashy stand boards that blew over in the wind, to what you see today.

We had competitions at Old Parliament House, Kioala Caravan park (where the dogs preferred the beach instead), and pretty much shows where we were cramped in a corner. I remember we ran in a car park once with carpets down as mats! We did demos everywhere and took every opportunity to get the crowd's attention – car parks, malls, Canberra basketball stadium, the Canberra raiders game where the crowd thought we were better than the actual game! Sponsors came on board - Pedigree, Pro Plan, Hills, Purina, pet shops, and now who ever we can get! The uniforms well they have really evolved. The judges looked like Basketball referees, shirts from teams were either hand crafted, or "a good deal" at the time, not as flashy as they are now.

When I started, I had a chair, esky, lead pegs for my dog, and maybe an umbrella. Today it's kitted out trailers, crates of all designs and my husband says, "there is more gear for a week let alone 1 day". Today I have dog 44G, still running 44D, 44E and 44F. I work one weekend and race the next, flat out busy you might say but I wouldn't have it any other way. Looking at some of the old photos makes me smile, as many fanatics like me are still around.
