Welcome

Well the dream has become reality.

As a Club we have discussed holding a competition for several years but the realisation that we could actually put a competition together started to gather momentum after we staged a mock competition two years ago in 2017.

But the seed started to grow when we went to the Flyball Nationals with one team in 2016 together with many new club members who came without dogs to watch that team compete and learn. That team who had never competed at a flyball competition as a team before just ran like they had been doing it for years. They were jumping heights at 13 or 14 inches and to our surprise at the end of the first day were leading their Division. However, during the second day rain intervened and general tiredness in both dogs and handlers resulted in the team finishing a gallant second in their Division, an outstanding result. That team of six dogs is much older and a little slower today but are competing in this competition not as that team but are represented in five of the six teams that are competing today.

That trip just created so much enthusiasm from those that attended, particularly the new members, that on returning home they immediately booked accommodation for the Nationals in Victoria for the following year as they were determined that their dogs would be competing as a team. In 2017 the Club did compete at those Flyball Nationals with two teams and were successful and again at the 2018 Nationals at Kiama. Since 2016 the Club has slowly built its membership of handlers and dogs to where we have enough dogs for 3 teams and are slowly building towards 4 teams as more dogs develop over the next six months.

In late 2018 the Club decided it was time to take the plunge to run our first competition and in January 2019 sought AFA sanction to host our first flyball competition "Out of the Wilderness" in November 2019. We gave ourselves plenty of lead time so that AFA members on the mainland could have sufficient time to plan to come to Tasmania.

We have received wonderful support from members of the AFA, who have given their time and provided guidance to ensure this event proceeded without too many issues. We have had great support from the Brighton Council, Tasmanian Government and the TT-Line to deal with the logistical matters of hosting an event in Tassie.

When we committed to hosting this event, we were comfortable that our Club could enter three teams and we were sure that we could find another team to meet the requirement to have a minimum of four teams for the competition to go ahead. We are blown away by the support from our fellow AFA members from Queensland and New South Wales who are travelling to our State to compete and it was a pleasant surprise to receive a team entry from CPAT, another Tassie Dog Club. To have six teams in our first competition is amazing.

There have been many AFA members who have told us they could not make it this year but they will be here next year.

We have tried to make this first flyball competition a special one to remember for those competing and we hope that we achieve that goal.

There will be many former and current members of the Club and Tassie based AFA members who have been involved with flyball in this State attending this competition who thought this day would never happen. We have never given up on the dream and we are pleased that many of you will be at the competition either competing, assisting or watching.

There are many organisations and people to thank and I have acknowledged them in a separate section. I will at this time acknowledge all the work of our organising committee over the last ten months, thank you.

There is a site map contained within this catalogue dealing all the amenities so please check that out, but if you have any questions on the day please ask. We have structured breaks during the competition. This will also ensure the lines at the canteen and coffee van are kept to a minimum. A mobile coffee van will be on site all day where you can purchase hot and cold drinks and snacks from 8am. Our canteen will be serving breakfast and hot and cold food and cold drinks all day from 6am.

Our Competition Stewards and Ball Shaggers will take away the need for teams to provide stewards and ball shaggers at the competition. These special people are from a combination of clubs, including from the mainland, who have come forward to help out. Some are new to Flyball but have done a lot of practical work over the last few months in preparation for the competition.

Our AFA Officials have flown or sailed across Bass Strait to be at the competition, thank you.

After the beginner's singles racing, we will only dismantle the race arena. So, grab your chairs, a drink and make yourself comfortable on the grass in preparation for the team placings to be announced along with other prizes and gifts. Later on in the catalogue are images of the raffle prizes - tickets are available. Again, a huge thanks to all the sponsors who have donated prizes for you all to have a chance to take home a gift – Good luck everyone!

There will be a social event on the Sunday at Wobbly Boot Vineyard, where you can take your pooches, enjoy a barbie and purchase drinks from the vineyard, it is not a bring your own drinks venue. Tassie Flying Paws will host the Barbie.

We hope and pray for good weather.

We look forward to the camaraderie and the start of everlasting friendships and I know for some there will be reconnections. We seek good spirited and respectful competition, where at the end of the day flyball is the winner.

Who are the Tassie Flying Paws Dog Club?

The Tassie Flying Paws Dog Club Inc. is a group of like-minded individuals who share a love of dogs of all breeds and undertaking dog sports with them.

The Club became an incorporated association in 2016 and was prior to this date predominately a club where flyball was the only dog sport undertaken. Since then the Club has increased its offering of dog sports to Rally-O, Noseworks and Agility.

The Club is affiliated with the Australian Flyball Association for flyball and the Tasmanian Canine Association (known as "Tas Dogs") for other dog sports.

There is weekly training for flyball and Rally-O while Noseworks training is run over 4-6 week blocks 4-5 times a year. At this stage Agility training will re-commence in early 2020 on a weekly basis.

The number of handlers and dogs within the Club has been slowly increasing year on year with dogs either training in only one dog sport or multiple dog sports. We are fortunate that we have dedicated and different trainers for each sport.

The Tassie Flying Paws Dog Club evolved from Tassie Flying Paws Flyball Racing which was established in the early 2000's. Since then changes to training locations and membership has seen the Club moved to its current location at the Pontville Recreation Ground since 2015.

Researching the AFA website reveals that the first flyball points earned by dogs competing under the team names of Tassie Flying Paws or Tassie Jack Jumpers was in 2005.

The Club's colours have changed from red to blue while the logo has changed to include the Club's new name Tassie Flying Paws Dog Club Inc. to reflect that we are not a single dog sports club.

Since the name change our flyball team names have reflected the names of distinctive Tasmanian animals/mammals/birds. The team Tassie Flying Paws is still registered with the AFA, but the team names we run under at this stage are Tassie Flying Devils, Tassie Flying Tigers and Tassie Flying Quolls. For this inaugural flyball competition the "Tassie" has been replaced in the team names by "Van Diemen's Land" as it is an open competition and regular competition team names can't be used.

Next year we hope there will be other first when we host our first sanctioned competitions for Noseworks, Rally-O and Agility. We also plan to increase the number of flyball competitions we host once we have recovered from hosting this first one.

We plan on this Club existing for all current and future members for a long time into the future for the enjoyment of all, especially the dogs.

Competition Format and Rules

The competition is an open handicap event where each team will compete in 3 heats per race. Each team will race all the other teams twice. This means if a dog was to run in every heat will would compete in 30 heats and therefore within the 40 heats per day maximum as set by the AFA.

The competition timetable is listed in the section Competition Timetable of this catalogue.

It is an AFA sanctioned event and will be run in accordance with the Rules and Policies of the Australian Flyball Association (AFA). Those rules and policies will be adhered to by AFA officials, AFA members and AFA honorary members on the day.

Everyone involved in the competition are reminded of their responsibilities as AFA members in terms of the Code of Ethics, respect for officials and each other and that this is a public event where flyball is on display.

Special Race Rules for the Competition

The special rules for this competition as a round robin handicap racing are the AFA rules for round robin format of racing with the following variations:

- To accommodate the handicap structure **there will be no restart** for first false start. Where the start dog from either team false starts that **dog must run again as the 5th dog**.
- The **sound system on the Signature lights is to be disconnected** (or programmed to silent) **during the start sequence so that both teams receive light signals only**. It may be reconnected after the first team's start to signal bad crosses.
- Handicap times will be calculated for each and every race based on the difference in seed/declared times of both teams
- Breakout times for every team will also be based on their seed/declared time minus 1 second. All teams will have a Breakout time in this format.

Determination of the Competition Winner

The following competition points are awarded for each round robin race:

- 2 points to the winning team;
- 1 point for each team for tied races
- 0 points to the losing team.

The team with the highest points at the end of the competition is the winner. In the event that two or more teams have the same number of competition points then for handicap racing, the winner using count back provisions will be determined by calculating the fastest adjusted time from the head to head race between those teams involved in the tie, and then applying the handicap of the slowest team involved in the tie. Any breakout times cannot be included in the calculations.

If the competition is abandoned under AFA Policy 4, results may not be declared unless at least one round robin has been completed. In which case the winner will be declared from the standings as of the last completed round robin.



Trophies

Some considerable thought went into determining both the name of our first competition and the trophies we would present.

The Club has during its short period of existence has participated in flyball demonstrations around the State (approximately 5-6 a year) and assisted other new clubs around the State in training for flyball. The only actual competitions our club dogs have competed in have been on the mainland and normally at the Flyball Nationals. So normally only one competition a year.

So, naming our first competition "Out of the Wilderness" just seemed appropriate with the natural beauty of the Tasmanian wilderness as a backdrop and our dogs "breaking out" of that wilderness to compete in our first competition. A special thank you to Louise Rowlands for designing the competition banner.

To keep with the theme to use the natural Tasmanian environment it was an easy step in the process to design our trophies based on Tasmania and where possible to use local timbers and local craftsmen to produce them.

Out of the Wilderness Competition Trophy

The competition trophies are based on maps of Tasmania and are made from Tasmanian timbers. The trophies are made from huon pine, blackwood, myrtle burl and blackheart sassafras. Leigh Cragg of Leewood Woodcrafts sourced the timber and created the trophy bases. Special thanks to Leigh. To further distinguish the trophies another local craftsman Paul Keir of MasterCast (www.mastercast.com.au) designed, cast and created the medallions plus the name plates for the trophies. Special thanks to Paul for his contribution.

Dot & Derek Baverstock Flyball Excellence Award

The Club has created this award to recognise the contribution to flyball in Tasmania of Dot and Derek Baverstock, who commenced training dogs in flyball some 17+ years ago at the Hobart Dog Training Club at Domain. It is through this introduction of flyball training that flyball gathered momentum in the State. It is through Dot and Derek that the very early members of what is now known as the Tassie Flying Paws Dog Club and some members of CPAT learnt about flyball and were trained.

Dot & Derek moved from Queensland to Tasmania some 18 years ago and brought with them their own flyball equipment having previously been members of the Awesome Pawsome Flyball Racing. They are well known by the AFA members in Queensland and within the flyball community.

Without Dot & Derek's initial guidance and direction many of the flyball dogs today in Tasmania would not be undertaking flyball at all so there are many dog handlers in Tasmania, particularly in our Club, who are forever grateful to them.

To be successful as a flyball team your 4 dogs running in a heat must complete the heat without fault the first criteria required to earn a flyball point for your dog, often referred to as a "clean run" and if your team was faster than the other team an additional point is earned. Our Club in competition focuses on "clean runs" and if we win a heat that is a bonus.

This Flyball Excellence Award will be awarded to the team that has the most "clean runs" during the competition where breakouts do not constitute a clean run for this award. In the event of a tie between teams the team whose average adjusted heat time is closest to their declared/seed time will be declared the winner. If there is still a tie then a sudden death one heat handicap race between the two teams will determine the winner.

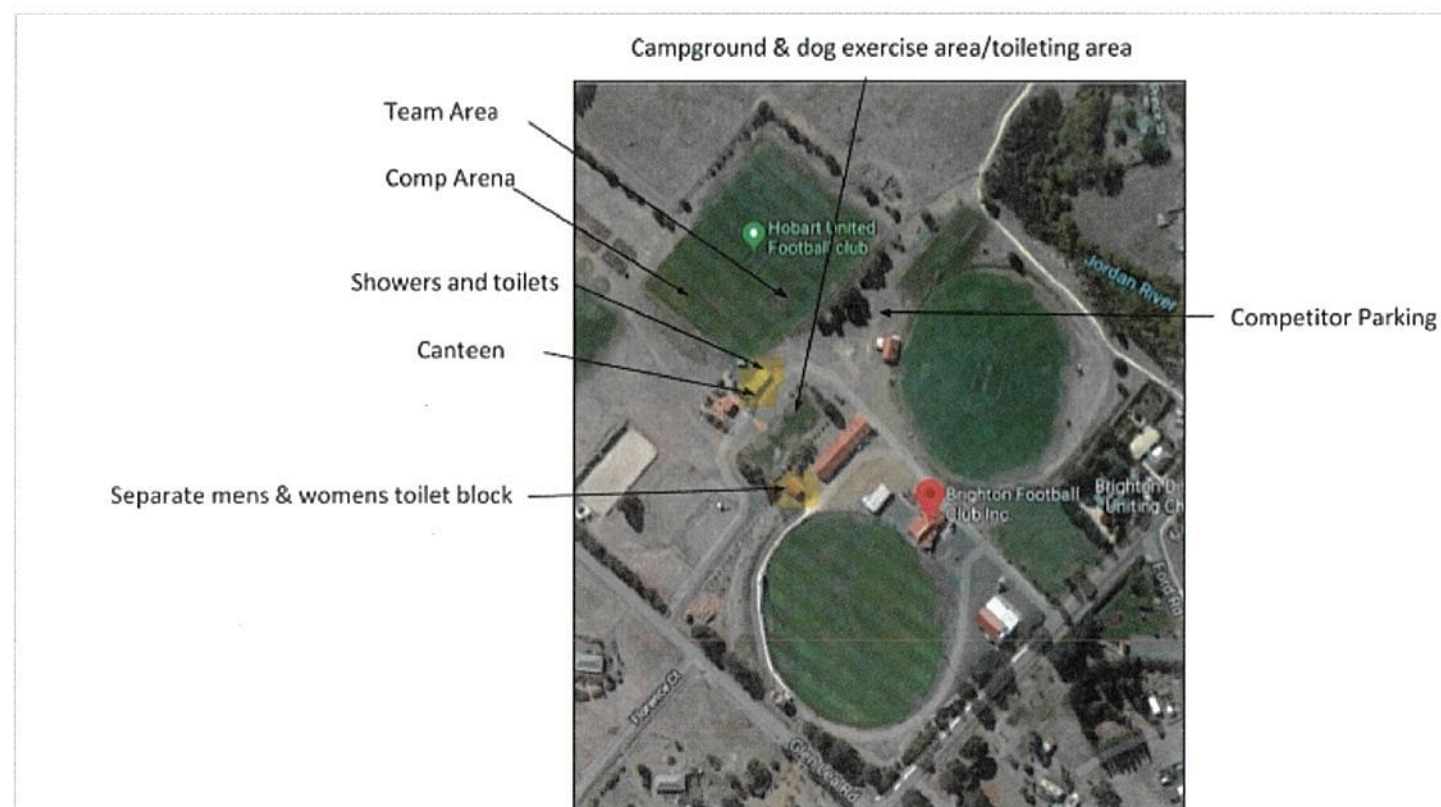
Site Layout

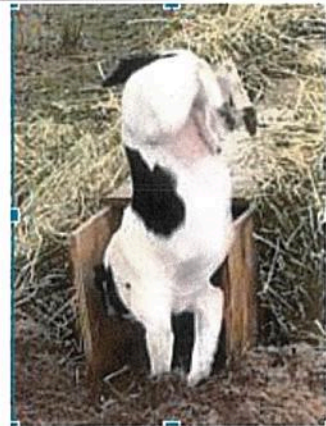

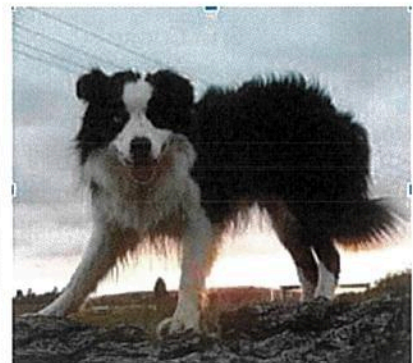

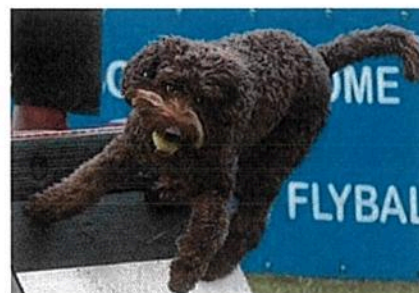
